Back to basics: Wash in & wash out

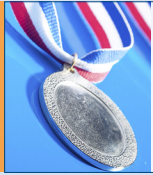
5. Environment

**1. Appropriate indications
for insertion**

**2. Discontinue as soon as
possible**

3. Proper insertion training

**4. Use aseptic technique
and sterile equipment**

**5. Maintain a closed
drainage system**

**6. Maintain unobstructed
urine flow**

7. Hand Hygiene
